



My Visit to the Ella Sharp Museum

There are two sets of restrooms inside the museum, one set on either side of the front desk. If I need to use the restroom, I can let my adult know and they can help take me there.



I can visit other buildings outside of the museum's main building. To go outside, I will use this door and then walk along the sidewalk.



While at the museum, I can see a planetarium show at the Hurst Planetarium. My adult will need to buy a separate ticket to see this show. During the show, we will learn about the planets and stars in our night sky. The room that we will sit in will be dark and other people may be sitting close to me. I will let my adult know if I need to take a break from the show. If I need to use the restroom, there are two restrooms in this building.
